

### Studio 1 Phineas Rose Wood Joinery

1112 Graves Mill Road, Madison (540) 948-4248

In **Richard & Ninika Gordon's** timber frame workshop/showroom they hand-make fine furniture using traditional joinery. **Jo Perez** will be displaying unique designs in stained glass. **Nancy Ross** will display new glazes, new pots, and new sculptures. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take 29N to Rt. 230W 4 miles, to Wolfstown. Turn right on Graves Mill Rd. (Rt. 662). 1 mile on right. See sign for Phineas Rose Wood Joinery. From Stanardsville, take 230E 7 miles, to Wolfstown. Turn left onto Rt. 662 and continue as above.**

### Studio 2 Noon Whistle Pottery

328 Main Street, Stanardsville (434) 985-6500

**Holly Horan** creates pottery inspired by love of gardening, cooking, and entertaining. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take Rt. 29N to Ruckersville. Take a left on Rt. 33W and continue for 10 miles. At traffic light for Stanardsville, take Bus. Rt. 33 into town. Studio is on the left.**

### Studio 3 SoLace Studios

193 W. Spotswood Avenue, Elkton (540) 298-5222

Using a 12th century technique called marbling, **Barbara Polin** creates one-of-a-kind silk clothing and leather accessories for men and women. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take Rt. 29N to Ruckersville. Take a left on Rt. 33W and continue for 20 miles past Shenandoah National Park to the Rt. 340N exit in Elkton. Turn left at 2nd light on Spotswood Ave. Continue four blocks. Studio on left with purple awnings just before light.**

### Studio 4 Jaeger & Ernst

4785 Burnley Station Lane, Barboursville (434) 973-7018

At the renovated train depot in Burnley Station, owners **Walter Jaeger & Craig Ernst** will exhibit their custom design/build furniture and cabinets. **Anita Whitney** will exhibit her 18K gold and sterling silver jewelry. Her main techniques are wire wrap and soldering. **Pamela Myers** creates colorful, functional pottery, hand painted with seasonal wooded landscapes. **Directions: From Rt. 29N go east on Burnley Station Rd. (Rt. 641). Go 4.5 miles, studio is on the right. From Rt. 250E take a left on 20N, go 6 miles, take a left onto Burnley Station Rd. (Rt. 641), go 2.5 miles. Studio is on the left after crossing the rail road tracks.**

### Studio 5 Mud Dauber Pottery

4225 Earlysville Road, Earlysville (434) 973-7943

In the renovated warehouse of the 1890's Earlysville General Store, studio owner **Suzanne Crane's** wheel-thrown stoneware vessels, sinks, tiles and tile tables will be on display. **Laurie Duxbury** combines time-less weaving techniques and contemporary colors to produce elegant textiles. Resident potter **Becky Garrity** will show her fine functional stoneware, celebrated for its Asian look and everyday use. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take Rt. 29N to Airport Rd. Turn left on Airport Rd. to roundabout. Take Dickerson Rd. (Rt. 606S) from roundabout toward Earlysville Rd. At next roundabout go right onto Earlysville Rd. (Rt. 743). We are 0.4 mile past Earlysville Green Shopping Center on your right.**

### Studio 6 Frederick Williamson Bowls

5623 Sugar Ridge Road, Crozet (434) 823-1882

**Fred Williamson** will display fine greenwood turned bowls. Local logs are transformed into functional salad bowls and decorative pieces. **Directions: From Charlottesville, go 12.5 miles west on Barracks Road (Rt. 614) to White Hall. At the Piedmont Store, go straight ahead passing on the LEFT side of the store onto Sugar Hollow Rd. Go 2.2 miles. Turn right on Sugar Ridge Rd., go 0.3 miles, turn right at blue mailbox with red cardinal, Box 5623. From Crozet, take Rt. 810N 5 miles to White Hall. Turn left onto Rt. 614 and continue as above.**

### Studio 7 The Barn Swallow

796 Gillums Ridge Road, Ivy (434) 979-4884

**Janice Arone** creates personal pots that meld function with originality. **Mary Ann Burk** offers etched, functional porcelain, wheel-thrown, altered, and high-fired in a gas kiln. **Enid Adams** of The Plains will show distinctive foliage prints on silk as art to wear. Textile artist **Lotta Helleberg** will show leaf-printed objects, such as wall hangings, bags, pillows and table linens. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take 250W, go 2.5 miles past the town of Ivy, turn left onto Rt. 682 (Gillums Ridge Rd.) and park.**

### Studio 8 Michael Keith Restoration

1304 E. Market Street, Suite E, Charlottesville (434) 979-7086

Creating furniture inspired by classic lines, **Michael Keith** also specializes in high-end restorations of period antiques. **Elizabeth Krome** works in both stoneware and porcelain, creating functional and decorative ware for everyday use. **Directions: From Rt. 250E turn right on High St. Then left on Meade Ave. At first traffic light, turn left on East Market St. Take immediate right into parking area. Studio at front of building. Additional parking in rear of building.**

### Studio 9 taviametel and Martha Keith

1304 E. Market Street, Suite V, Charlottesville (434) 466-4042

In this shared jewelry studio, **Tavia Brown** creates one-of-a-kind and custom wearable pieces in various metals and materials, and **Martha Keith** will show her water-inspired jewelry designs in gold, silver, and niobium. **Directions: See directions for Studio 8. Front left corner of building.**

### Studio 10 Brian Rayner Design

4428 Blenheim Road, Charlottesville (434) 295-7042

**Brian Rayner** will demonstrate his process of allowing the wood to dictate form and beauty. **Directions: From Charlottesville take 20S to Rt. 53 towards Monticello. After passing Monticello, veer right towards Ash Lawn, into James Monroe Parkway. Continue 6 miles past Ash Lawn and Morven and at Blenheim Rd. turn left. Follow Blenheim Rd. 2 miles, the studio is the first right after passing Quandary Farm on the right.**

### Studio 11 A. Korotky Studio

2331 Highland Avenue, Charlottesville (434) 295-5057

**Andrea Korotky** weaves one-of-a-kind, original textiles using traditional methods on an 8-harness loom. Display and demonstration.

**Judith Ligon** will show her wearable art inspired by the myriad shapes, colors, and designs as found in nature. **Directions: From Rt. 250 turn onto McIntire Rd., go approx. 1.5 miles, turn right onto Cherry Ave., go 1.5 miles, turn right onto Highland Ave. 6th house on left.**

### Studio 12 Mary Beth Bellah

1855 Arrowhead Valley Road, Charlottesville (434) 409-9213

**Mary Beth Bellah** takes quilting into 3-dimensional space combining traditional and non-traditional elements. **Joanne Fletcher** gets her inspiration from her garden for her handwoven "wearable garden." **Directions: From Charlottesville take Rt. 29S toward Lynchburg. 3.25 miles after the I-64 interchange, turn left on Rt. 745 (Arrowhead Valley Rd.). Go 1 mile, studio is on the left. Take gravel drive to the house, park in grass along drive for easy turn-around.**

### Studio 13 Nan Rothwell Studio

221 Pottery Lane, Faber (434) 263-4023

**Nan Rothwell** makes functional salt glazed, stoneware, and wood fired pottery. **Meredith Bennett** will show a range of fiber arts, including braids, felted work, and weavings. **Directions: From Charlottesville take Rt. 29S about 25 miles. Turn right on Rt. 6W. After 1.75 miles. Take the first left, Rt. 634 (Adial Rd.). After 0.8 mile, take the next left, Rt. 613 (Rocky Rd.). After 0.5 mile, take the next left, Pottery Lane. Bear left at the fork. From west of Charlottesville, take Rt. 250 west, turn left on 151S. After 8.9 miles, turn left on Rt. 6E. After 3.8 miles, take first right, Rt. 634 (Adial Rd.) and continue as described above.**

### Studio 14 2 Art Studios Gallery 161

**Tanya Tyree** creates abstract raku fired ceramic sculptures, jewelry, and functional forms. Display and demonstration. **Gary Dalton** makes furniture serving clients' unique functional and aesthetic needs. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take I-64W to Crozet and use exit 107. Take Rt. 250W to the base of Afton Mountain, and then turn left onto Rt. 151S, follow signs to Wintergreen Resort. After 4 miles turn left onto 2nd Avon Rd., across from Afton Mountain Bed and Breakfast. Gallery is the first driveway on the left.**

### Studio 15 Wayfarer Forge

3261 Afton Mountain Road, Afton (434) 465-5993

**Gerald Boggs** creates classical forge iron for the home. **Directions: From Charlottesville, take I-64W to exit 107, turn left on Rt. 250. As you near the top of the pass, Rt. 6 will appear; take it, and Wayfarer Forge is 0.5 mile on the right.**
